Because the track needs to be booked several months in advance, this is a final call for expressions of interest.

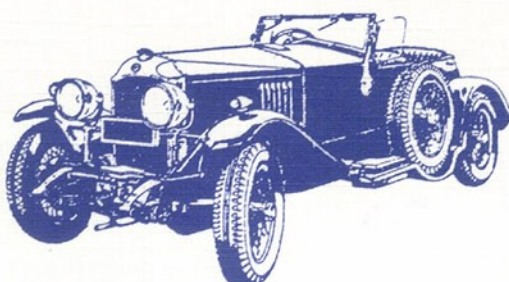

We need confirmations by the end of December in order to make a decision by early January.

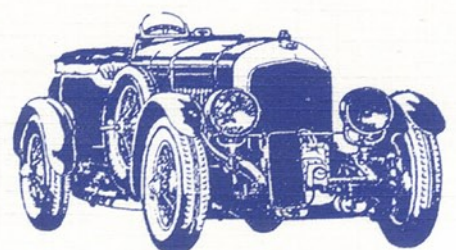
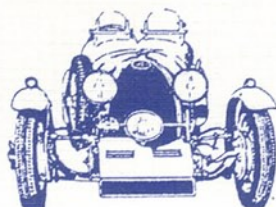
The Newsletter
