To the Loaded Dog with an old dog

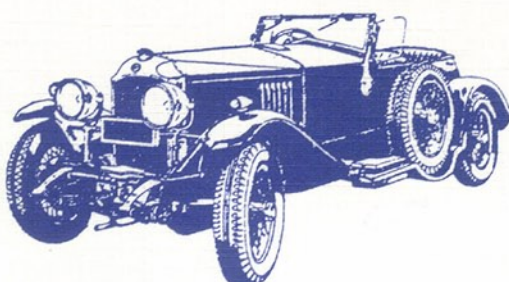

Canberra Driving Tests

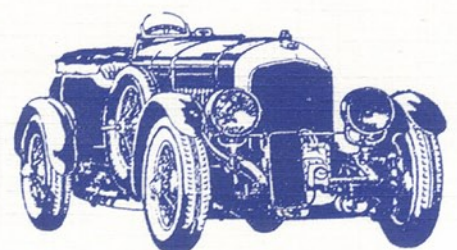
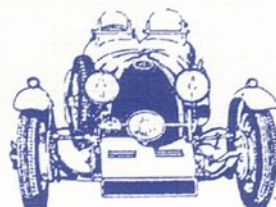
